Richard A. (Dick) Dunning is a Peterborough resident who grew up in Dublin. Dick was with the United States Army Special Forces from 1966-1969 and served in Vietnam in 1968. He received a bronze star for heroism and a purple heart. He was teaching principal of Dublin Consolidated School for 12 years and then retired as Principal of South Meadow Middle School in 2013.

He has been married to Wendy for 51 years and they have two children, Shannon and Courtney, as well as grandchildren. Dick is still very active in the community and is on the ConVal School Board and Peterborough Cemetery Committee. He is a Corporal in the 6th New Hampshire Volunteer Infantry Regiment, Company E, a nonprofit historical association, and is a life member of Cheney-Armstrong American Legion Post 5.
