



Dublin Recycling Instructions

ALL HOUSEHOLD WASTE DEPOSITED INTO THE TRASH COMPACTOR MUST NOT INCLUDE THE RECYCLABLE ITEMS LISTED BELOW.

Glass (all colors)

Jars and Bottles. No ceramics, light bulbs, window glass, mirrors or Pyrex. Please rinse and remove caps.

Plastic

PETE #1 and HDPE #2 Plastic. Milk, juice and water jugs, opaque colors detergent bottles etc. No yogurt or butter tubs, etc. Please rinse and remove caps.



Aluminum

Beverage cans (soda, beer, etc.).

Tin

Cans, aluminum pet food cans, aluminum foil and plates, etc. Please rinse.

Newspaper

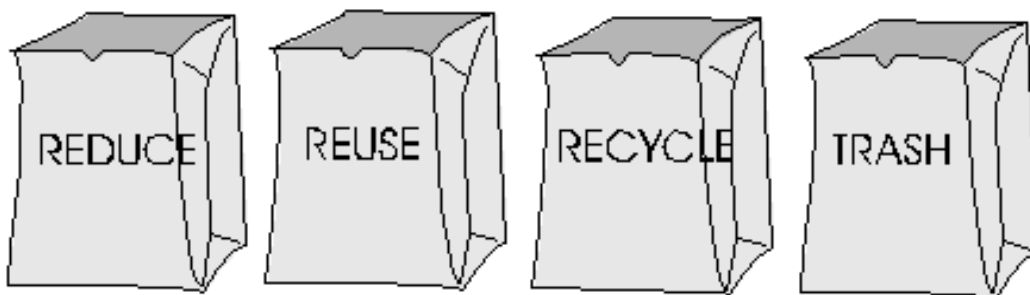
Newspaper. Remove glossy inserts and place with magazines.

Magazines

Glossy magazines and glossy newspaper inserts.

Mixed Paper

Office paper, junk mail, cereal boxes (no waxed liner), soda and beer cartons, egg cartons, phone books, paperback books and hard cover books with covers removed, etc. No milk or juice containers, waxed paper, foil covered paper or frozen food containers.



Corrugated Cardboard

Cardboard and brown paper bags. No waxed or plastic coated cardboard. Please breakdown, cardboard must be clean and dry.

Batteries

Used batteries (wet or dry), battery collection bins are located adjacent to the “Used Motor Oil for Recycling” tank.

Used Motor Oil For Recycling

Motor Oil must not be mixed with gas, solvents or other hazardous wastes. See the Transfer Station Superintendent for proper disposal.

Scrap Metal

Scrap metal such as cast iron, light iron, steel and sheet metal etc., is stored in the red dumpster across from the recycling building. Aluminum, copper, brass and other precious metals are stored at a separate location. See the Transfer Station Superintendent for directions.

Bulky Items

Appliances, TV’s, Computer Equipment, etc., require a fee. See the Transfer Station Superintendent for assistance.

Household Hazardous Wastes

Dublin residents can use the Keene Recycling Center for their hazardous wastes. See the Transfer Station Superintendent for details.

Construction Debris

All construction materials, furniture, etc. are subject to restrictions and fees. See the Transfer Station Superintendent for assistance.

Brush

The brush pile is limited to brush five inches or less in diameter and untreated wood with an end cross-sectional area of twenty-four square inches or less. One pick-up truck per day is allowed.

Compost Pile

The compost pile is adjacent to the brush pile. Compost is limited to yard waste and leaves. No food.

Tires

Tires with or without rims are subject to fees. See the Transfer Station Superintendent for assistance.



Remarkable Recycling Facts



- Enough energy is saved by recycling one aluminum can to run a TV set for three hours or to light one 100 watt bulb for 20 hours.
- Five recycled plastic bottles make enough fiberfill to stuff a ski jacket.
- Glass is the ideal environmental package: it is 100 percent recyclable and can be recycled over and over again to make new containers without any loss of quality.
